Fall 2012

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,052 includes 516 new freshmen and 185 new transfer students for Fall 2012. There are 24 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, sixty-five percent (1,334) of the undergraduates are female, and more than seventy percent (1,445) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-five percent of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 1,970 (97.0%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 78 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 83.6% of undergraduates. More than ninety-one percent are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, just under sixty-two percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1095 and 23 for the ACT examination. Approximately 17% of undergraduates have declared a major in Biology, while an additional 17% have declared Nursing and seven percent Psychology.

Fall 2011

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,088 includes 500 new freshmen and 163 new transfer students for Fall 2011. There are 27 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, almost sixty-six percent (1,370) of the undergraduates are female, and sixty-eight percent (1,416) are

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained.
